

ADVANSIX ACHIEVES VPP STAR CERTIFICATION AT POTTSVILLE SITE*Recognition by OSHA of Company's Commitment to Health and Safety*

Parsippany, N.J. and Pottsville, Pa., August 27, 2018 - AdvanSix said today its Pottsville, Pennsylvania site has been certified as a "Star" worksite in the Voluntary Protection Program (VPP), part of the Occupational Safety and Health Administration's (OSHA) workplace site safety program. This is the highest level of recognition for workplace safety and health excellence granted by the government agency.

The company marked the achievement raising a flag outside the site in Pottsville at a ceremony attended by OSHA representatives, company leadership, employees and their families.

"AdvanSix has a relentless focus on safety, as the health and well-being of our employees in Pottsville and across the company is fundamental to our success," said Erin Kane, president and CEO of AdvanSix. "Achieving VPP Star designation is another example of our commitment to excellence and to doing things the right way."

Pottsville is the first AdvanSix site to be certified with a VPP Star. The recognition comes following a rigorous application and on-site inspections. The plant has implemented many employee-led safety programs and initiatives enabling recorded injury rates below industry averages. The site manufactures nylon films used in food packaging, book covers and other applications, and employs more than 80 people.

VPP recognizes employers who have implemented effective safety and health management systems, and that maintain injury and illness rates below national averages. VPP represents management, labor, and OSHA working together to prevent

fatalities, injuries, and illnesses through hazard prevention and control, worksite analysis, training, management commitment, and worker involvement.
