



## **Conflict Minerals Policy Statement**

A strict commitment to compliance and to our core values of Safety, Accountability, Integrity and Respect is fundamental to the AdvanSix mission. In 2012, the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (“SEC”) issued rules implementing the “conflict minerals” disclosure requirements of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act (the “Conflict Minerals Rules”), which require SEC registrants who manufacture or contract to manufacture products containing tantalum, tin, tungsten or gold (“Conflict Minerals”) that are necessary to such products’ functionality or production to disclose the origin and status of the Conflict Minerals. Accordingly, the Conflict Minerals Rules require AdvanSix to undertake due diligence steps to determine if any of its products contain Conflict Minerals, and if so, to determine if the Conflict Minerals originate in the Democratic Republic of Congo and bordering countries and report to the SEC on its Conflict Minerals inquiries and the potential use of Conflict Minerals in its products.

AdvanSix’s compliance program includes a number of elements, such as the following:

1. Analysis to identify whether any of our products contain Conflict Minerals or are otherwise covered by the Conflict Minerals Rules.
2. Communicating to our global supply chain our obligations under the Conflict Minerals Rules.
3. Flow down of Conflict Minerals compliance provision in purchase agreements with direct material suppliers.
4. Use compliance with Conflict Minerals Rules as a criterium to select suppliers of raw materials.
5. Requiring our suppliers to exercise due diligence on the course and chain of custody of any Conflict Minerals and provide annual assurance of compliance following OECD Due Diligence Guidance for Responsible Supply Chains of Minerals from Conflict-Affected and High-Risk Areas.
6. Engagement with suppliers regarding compliance with our policies regarding Conflict Minerals.

AdvanSix is committed to the responsible sourcing of Conflict Minerals throughout its global supply chain and to compliance with the Conflict Minerals Rules.
