



How Ammonium Sulfate Boosts Forage Production

Scientific research reinforces the value of ammonium sulfate in forage production. Learn how:

- In a three-year Virginia Tech study on stockpiled tall fescue production, both ammonium sulfate and ammonium nitrate were found to be superior N sources to urea, urea-ammonium nitrate (UAN) and broiler litter.
- In a four-year continuous stocking study also conducted by Virginia Tech, fertilizing tall fescue with ammonium sulfate led to higher daily calf gains than tall fescue fertilized with ammonium nitrate.
- A forage expert with the University of Georgia emphasizes the importance of the nitrogen to sulfur ratio (N:S) in forage production.
- Miner Institute data show the declining trend in tissue S concentration of common forages in the northeastern United States over a 10-year period.
